
Remember that all parents of all the Scouts are invited and encouraged to attend. Please RSVP to Brian.

The display consisted of: a recruiting bulletin board, First Aid Kit, new tent, and kayak. It sure made an impression on the Cub Scouts and their parents.


It should also be noted that the computer donated to Troop 236 was used to create the display board; which turned out FANTASTIC!
